**SUBJECT: Narrows Hydroelectric Project
FERC Project No. 1403
Notification of Intent to File an Application for a New License (NOI) and
Request for Designation as Non-Federal Representative for Informal Consultation
under ESA and NHPA**

Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to Section (§) 5.5 of Title 18 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), the Yuba County Water Agency (YCWA), a special district under California State law, gives notice to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) of YCWA's intent to file an application for a new license for the Narrows Hydroelectric Project, FERC Project Number (No.) 1403 (Project), on, or before, January 31, 2024. YCWA is the existing licensee and current owner and operator of the Project.

In addition, this letter requests that the FERC authorize YCWA as FERC's non-federal representative for carrying out informal consultation, pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

Simultaneously with the filing of this Notice of Intent (NOI), under separate cover YCWA has e-Filed with FERC a Pre-Application Document (PAD) in conformance with 18 C.F.R. Section 5.6 and a letter requesting FERC's authorization for YCWA to use FERC's traditional process to relicense the Project.

PROJECT NUMBER

The FERC Project Number for the Narrows Hydroelectric Project is 1403.

LICENSE EXPIRATION DATE

The Federal Power Commission, FERC's predecessor, issued the original Project license to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) on February 11, 1993, stating that the license would be effective for the period from February 1, 1993, through January 31, 2023. On January 26, 2018, the FERC approved PG&E's request to extend the license term to January 31, 2026. On May 2, 2019, the FERC approved the transfer of the license from PG&E to YCWA.

UNEQUIVOCAL STATEMENT OF INTENT TO FILE AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW LICENSE

YCWA's intent is to file with the FERC an Application for New License Major Project - Existing Dam (18 C.F.R. § 4.5.1) for the Narrows Hydroelectric Project by January 31, 2024, two years prior to the expiration of the existing FERC license.

TYPE OF PRINCIPAL PROJECT WORKS LICENSED

The Narrows Hydroelectric Project consists of one development – Narrows – whose principal works include: 1) Narrows Tunnel, a 1,077-foot (ft)-long tunnel that connects a United States (U.S.) Department of Defense, Army Corps of Engineers' (USACE) tunnel to the Project's penstock; 2) Narrows Penstock, a 266-ft-long steel pipe penstock that connects Narrows Tunnel to the Narrows 1 Powerhouse and includes a surge pipe; 3) Narrows 1 Powerhouse; and 4) a Powerhouse Access Tram. The Project does not include any dams or reservoirs, open water conveyance facilities, switchyards, transmission lines, roads, streamflow gages, recreation facilities, or active borrow or spoil areas. The FERC Project Boundary includes 2.92-acres (ac): 2.37 ac, which are YCWA lands on which all aboveground Project facilities and features are located, and 0.55 ac of USACE lands, which are above Narrows Tunnel (i.e., no surface facilities).

INSTALLED PLANT CAPACITY

The Project has one powerhouse with one generating unit. The total FERC-authorized installed capacity for Narrows 1 Powerhouse is 12,000 kilowatts.

The Harry Englebright Dam and Reservoir federal facility, which is operated by the USACE, is upstream of the Project. The Project takes advantage of water withdrawn from USACE's Englebright Dam intake and tunnel, which transitions into the Project's power tunnel, for power generation.
